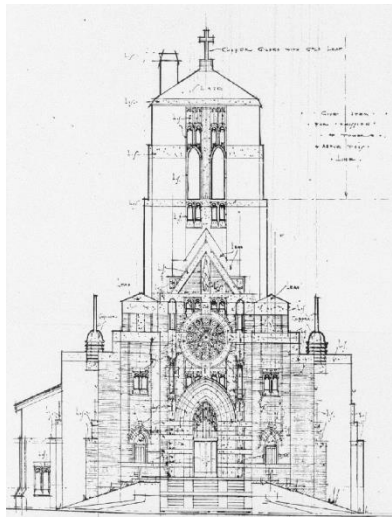




ST. MARY'S TIMELINE



TIMELINE OF OUR PARISH HISTORY

St. Mary's Church is our spiritual home in Franklin. We have gathered in this meeting place of God and man to solemnize His most sacred feasts. Throughout the years, God's house has welcomed us in the celebration of great events of both joy and sorrow in our lives. The highlights of St. Mary's history reflect the dedication and service of the parish family.

- 1849 - Five people attend Mass offered by Fr. Charles O'Reilly at the John L. Fitzpatrick home on Medway Road (now 316 Lincoln Street).
- 1851 - Catholics are given the use of the town hall for Mass. Rev. M. X. Carroll offers Mass monthly at the Town Hall.
- 1862 - Rev. Michael McCable of Woonsocket replaces Rev. Carroll.
- 1864 - On November 8, the town approves the cemetery on land formerly owned by Hugh McParland.
- 1865 - Mary Tobin, who died on July 29 at age 19, is the first to be interred in the cemetery. Her headstone is later taken down and her name put on the Dugan stone.
- 1871 - A church, built in 1788, is purchased from the Congregational Society and becomes a mission station. This is our first church.
- 1877 - On February 6, St. Mary's becomes an independent parish, with Rev. James Griffin as first pastor.**
- 1879 - Archbishop Williams confirms Franklin and Wrentham children.
- 1885 - Rev. John L. Mulcahy becomes the second pastor, upon the death of Father Griffin.
- 1888 - The church is dedicated by Archbishop Williams.
- 1890 - Archbishop Williams confers the sacrament of Confirmation on a large class of 95 children.
- 1891 - Rev. Martin J. Lee becomes the third pastor of St. Mary's.
- 1893 - Fr. Lee establishes a parochial school with two rooms in the church basement. A convent is set up on Oak Street with two more classrooms on the first floor.
 - In September, St. Mary's Grammar School is opened with four Daughters of Charity of St. Vincent de Paul in charge.
- 1899 - A large brick building is constructed on the corner of Beaver Street to provide a school, gymnasium, and assembly hall.
 - Around 1899, the old church (over 110 years old) is declared unsafe. Mass is now celebrated in the old Morse Opera House until a makeshift chapel can be arranged.
- 1900 - The original church is completely destroyed by fire on June 26.
- 1902 - The school closes. The parish is heavily in debt.

- 1903 - Rev. Daniel P. Scannell becomes fourth pastor of St. Mary's.
- 1904 - Bishop Brady dedicates the ground floor of the school building on the corner of Beaver Street as a chapel on November 13.
- 1916 - Father Scannell establishes the Knights of Columbus and serves as chaplain.
- 1921 - The Catholic Women's Club is organized, with Miss Anna T. Kelly as president.
- 1923 - The chapel building is destroyed by fire on May 30.
- The cornerstone of the third St. Mary's Church, the present church, is blessed by Cardinal O'Connell on September 2.
- 1924 - The first Mass is celebrated in the basement chapel on Ash Wednesday, March 5, by Fr. Scannell.
- Rev. Edward Kenney is appointed fifth pastor on December 21.
- 1927 - On September 18, the first Solemn High Mass is sung in the upper church, celebrating the Golden Jubilee of the parish. Fr. Kenney is the celebrant.**
- Assumption Parish, South Bellingham, is cut from St. Mary's and is established as a parish by Cardinal O'Connell.
- 1932 - Father Kenney announces plans to build a new rectory.
- 1942 - Released time for one hour of religious instruction is granted by the School Committee for junior high and high school pupils.
- 1944 - The Home of the Holy Child for children from broken homes opens in the convent.
- 1947 - St. Jude's Parish, Norfolk, is established from St. Mary's by Archbishop Cushing.
- 1949 - Rev. James J. McManus is appointed administrator.
- Cistercian Nuns come from Ireland to Mount St. Mary's Abbey.
- 1950 - Rev. George M. Dowd is appointed sixth pastor of St. Mary's.
- New carpeting is installed in the church.
- 1951 - Archbishop Cushing gives the Pontifical Blessing to Our Lady of Grace Shrine (located on the church lawn) and the newly erected crucifix (at the cemetery). Archbishop Cushing also celebrates the Solemn Pontifical Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament at an altar set up in front of the rectory.
- 1952 - St. Mary's celebrates its 75th anniversary with a three-day celebration.**
- Msgr. Kenney celebrates his Golden Jubilee as a priest.
- 1953 - The Legion of Mary is formed on October 27, 1953.
- The six new statues on the façade of the church and the new interior statues are dedicated in December. The renovated altar is also dedicated.
- 1956 - St. Mary's School opens. The dedication and blessing of St. Mary's School is held in September. The laying of the cornerstone of the school and the blessing of the interior of the school also take place.
- 1959 - The parish publishes a weekly newspaper as part of St. Mary's School Development Fund.

- 1960 - Rt. Rev. Msgr. Dowd is called home to God on May 11.
 - Rt. Rev. William E. Collins becomes seventh pastor of St. Mary's on May 24.
- 1962 - The First Annual Parish Reunion is held.
- 1971 - Msgr. Collins retires on May 11. Msgr. Collins is called home to God on November 29, 1978.
 - Rev. Albert G. Fairbanks is appointed St. Mary's eighth pastor on May 11.
 - The Parish Council is formed.
- 1972 - St. Mary's School closes.
 - The Parish Club and Catholic Youth Organization are both formed in January.
 - St. Mary's First Spring Festival is held.
- 1974 - A fire damages St. Mary's School.
- 1975 - Baptismal robes, presented at the sacrament of Baptism, are handmade by a parishioner.
- 1976 - Refurbishing of church and properties is completed, including a new altar downstairs, and plans are made for redoing the main sanctuary.
 - The Our Lady of Hope Charismatic Prayer Group is formed in September.
- 1977 - St. Mary's enters into its second century of service as our spiritual home. Cardinal Medeiros is the principal celebrant of the Mass of Thanksgiving on the occasion of the 100th anniversary of St. Mary's Parish.**
 - The Junior C.Y.O. is formed in March.
 - At Christmas, the first group of men is commissioned as lay Ministers of the Eucharist.
- 1979 - The first Feast of St. Rocco is organized in August.
- 1980 - The 1000 Club, a monthly raffle to support the parish, is formed.
- 1981 - The Parish Council is reestablished.
- 1982 - Fr. Albert Fairbanks is called home to God on September 11.
 - Rev. Henry P. Boivin is appointed ninth pastor of St. Mary's on December 14.
- 1983 - A new electric lift for handicapped parishioners is installed and dedicated.
 - Five ceiling fans are installed in the upper church.
 - A parish census takes place.
 - There are 2,300 families registered with St. Mary's.
- 1984 - On February 2, a Holy Year Pilgrimage Mass is celebrated.
 - In February, the first group of women is commissioned as lay Ministers of the Eucharist.
 - The Respect Life Committee is formed.
 - The Eucharistic Ministers begin to bring the Eucharist to homebound parishioners.
- 1985 - The Baptismal Catechesis group is formed to assist parents, the prime educators of their child's faith, to prepare for their child's baptism.
- 1986 - The Spiritual Development Committee is established.

- St. Mary's Parish Sacrificial Giving Program continues to tithe (10%).
- The Caring Tree, St. Mary's Christmas outreach program, begins.
- 1987 - The R.C.I.A. program begins in the fall.
- A new addition to the rectory is constructed.
- 1988 - Fr. Boivin ends his pastorate, effective September 1.
- Fr. Edward Gillis and then Fr. Edward Gaudette serve as Administrators.
- Fr. James E. O'Leary is appointed tenth pastor of St. Mary's on October 25.
- 1989 - St. Mary's becomes part of the newly-formed West Region of the Archdiocese of Boston on January 1.
- The Vocation Crucifix Program of Prayer is initiated.
- In September, the Parish Worship Committee meets for the first time.
- St. Mary's School will be known as St. Mary's Parish Center.
- 1990 - St. Mary's Conference of the Society of St. Vincent de Paul is established.
- The food pantry is established on the lower floor of the rectory under the direction of the St. Vincent de Paul Society. There is a collection of nonperishable foods on the first weekend of each month.
- A newly formed Welcome Committee helps new parishioners learn about the parish.
- 1991 - The Fellowship Committee is formed.
- The Marthas and Marys Prayer Group is formed.
- New Christmas crib figures are purchased.
- The Parish Pastoral Council is established.
- 1992 - In October, the painting of the lower church is completed.
- 1993 - Painting of the upper church begins after Easter.
- There are over 3,100 families registered with St. Mary's.
- There are over 10,000 parishioners registered with St. Mary's.
- Almost 1,600 children are enrolled in the parish religious education program.
- A new wheelchair lift is installed and ready for use.
- 1994 - The Marian Prayer Group is formed.
- The St. Mary's Youth Community Service Corps is formed.
- The Olive Branch, our "storefront" outreach ministry, opens on Main Street.
- The Teen Choir is established in September.
- The first annual town-wide Relay for Life takes place.
- Members of the Ushers' Group are renamed Ministers of Hospitality. The group is opened to both men and women.
- 1995 - The Benjamin Franklin Classical Charter School is granted a license to use St. Mary's School building for the 1995-1996 school year.
- Fr. James O'Leary is transferred to St. Camillus, effective August 1.
- Weekly Sunday Eucharistic "Holy Hour" with Benediction begins in July.
- Rev. Thomas J. Walsh is appointed St. Mary's eleventh pastor, effective October 20.
- The Finance Committee is formed.
- The Pastoral Visitors program is expanded.

- St. Mary's Prayer Wall is initiated.
- 1996 - The Bereavement Ministry is established in February.
- Ordained on June 14, 1946, Fr. Francis W. Beksha celebrates a Mass of Thanksgiving on June 9 on the occasion of his 50th Golden Jubilee.
- A committee is formed regarding the feasibility of reopening the parish school.
- The Health Ministry program begins.
- New church doors are installed in July.
- 1997 - *The Weave*, our parish quarterly newsletter, goes to print in April.
- Meetings of St. Mary's Ultreyas for Cursillo begin.
- A coordinator of Health and Homebound Ministry/Parish Nurse is appointed.
- The rectory roof is repaired.
- The church roof is repaired.
- A parish census is conducted in November.
- 1998 - A second 9:00 a.m. Sunday Mass in the lower church is added.
- The Mothers' Group is formed.
- New hand-carved doors are installed at the entrances to the church.
- The school roof is replaced.
- A new boiler is installed in the school building.
- New pews are installed in the upper church. Pews include special seating for physically handicapped parishioners.
- New carpeting is installed in the upper church.
- The 20th Festival of St. Rocco is held in August of 1998 on the school grounds.
- 1999 - St. Mary's year-long 2000 Spiritual Treasures program is undertaken in preparation for the millennium and the Jubilee Year.
- The parish dedicates three Fridays a month for all-day Eucharistic Adoration.
- The St. Monica Sodality is formed.
- There are over 2,000 children in the religious education program.
- Bernard Cardinal Law visits St. Mary's in December.
- 2000 - The Jubilee Committee is established.
- Jubilee Week is held from July 15 to July 23.
- Air conditioning is installed in the upper church.
- The Grief Support group begins.
- The Alpha program begins.
- 2001 - The Jubilee year concludes on January 6, 2001.
- A second 10:30 a.m. Sunday Mass is added in the lower church on February 4.
- New carpeting is installed on the first floor and the lower floor of the rectory.
- New carpeting is installed in the lower church.
- St. Mary's is one of the 11 pilot parishes for *Promise for Tomorrow*, the capital and endowment campaign for the Archdiocese of Boston.
- Painting of the upper church begins in November.

- 2002 - On February 6, 2002, St. Mary's celebrates its 125th anniversary: 125 years of faith, hope, love, and service.**
- Refurbishing of the upper church is completed.
 - The interior of the upper church is completely repainted and relit.
 - The bricks on the façade of the church undergo pointing in April.
 - Extensive repair work is done on the bricks around the rose window.
 - The 125th Anniversary Mass of Thanksgiving is celebrated on June 23.
 - The 125th anniversary dinner is held on October 20 at the Myriad Ballroom in Mendon.
 - 4,271 families are registered with St. Mary's.
 - 14,558 parishioners are registered with St. Mary's.
 - The Caring Tree touches the hearts of 688 individuals.
 - For Christmas Eve, there are three Masses at 4:00 p.m., two Masses at 6:00 p.m., and one at 7:30 p.m. On Christmas Day, Masses are celebrated at 9:00 a.m., 10:30 a.m., and 12:00 noon.
- 2003 - Life Teen Masses and Life Nights are held.**
- **On February 6, 2003, the 9:00 a.m. Mass is celebrated as the closing Mass for St. Mary's 125th anniversary year.**
 - Masses for Lent are celebrated Monday through Friday at 7:00 a.m., 9:00 a.m., and 5:15 p.m., and Saturday at 8:00 a.m.
 - Morning Prayer for Lent is held at 6:30 a.m. Monday through Friday.
 - Religious Education classes are held Sunday mornings, Monday through Thursday afternoons, and Monday evenings.
 - The weekend Mass schedule is Saturday at 4:00 p.m. and 7:00 p.m., and Sunday at 7:30 a.m., 9:00 a.m. (upstairs and downstairs), 10:30 a.m. (upstairs and downstairs), and 12:00 noon.
 - The Town of Franklin celebrates its 225th anniversary.
 - The Armed Forces Banner is established in both the upper and lower churches.
 - St. Mary's Health Ministry revives the Parish Activities Council.
 - *The History of St. Mary's Parish, on the Occasion of the 125th Anniversary (1877-2002)* is published.
 - St. Mary's Respect Life Committee sponsors the first scholarship essay contest.
 - A video documentary on the history of St. Mary's Parish, entitled *Journey of Faith*, premieres.
 - The Music Ministry consists of Children's Choir, Teen Choir, Adult Choir, Contemporary Choir, and Cantors.
 - Commemorative plates featuring a picture of St. Mary's church are available for parishioners.
 - The Year of the Most Holy Rosary concludes.
 - The priests explain the liturgical changes to the Mass.
 - Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament is held each Friday from 9:30 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.
 - Masses on Christmas Eve are celebrated at 4:00 p.m. (upstairs and downstairs), 4:00 p.m. at Dean College (Children's Pageant), 6:00 p.m. (up and down), and 7:30 p.m. (up). Christmas morning Masses are celebrated at 9:00 a.m., 10:30 a.m., and 12:00 noon.

- The clergy at St. Mary's are Fr. Thomas Walsh, Fr. Carlos Kim, Fr. David Goodrow, Fr. Francis Beksha (in residence), and Deacon Richard Delio.
- 2004
- The Prayer Shawl Ministry is established.
 - St. Mary's is clustered with St. Joseph's (Medway) and St. Thomas's (Millis), in conjunction with the initial steps of looking at parish reconfiguration.
 - Parishioners may bring palms from last year or a previous year to church to be burned for ashes for Ash Wednesday.
 - The Sisters of Our Lady of Mercy, from a religious order that Sr. Faustina founded, attend the Divine Mercy Holy Hour.
 - Memorial plaques are available for placement on the book racks of the pews in the upper church.
 - A new parish census is undertaken.
 - Fr. Kim's assignment ends in June. Fr. Kim begins a sabbatical.
 - Fr. Bob Congdon helps celebrate weekend Masses.
 - Every Sunday evening, a Rosary for Peace is prayed.
 - Nancy Rafter is appointed Pastoral Associate.
 - Some repair work on the tiles of the church and rectory roofs is finished.
 - The parish picnic is held in June.
 - *Journey of Faith*, the video history of our parish, takes first place in the News / Information category at the New England Cable Television Association Awards.
 - The 10:30 downstairs Sunday Mass is discontinued.
 - Fr. Ted Kofitse begins his assignment at St. Mary's.
 - A Holy Hour is held each Monday evening to celebrate the Year of the Eucharist, which begins in October 2004.
- 2005
- For the first time, St. Mary's offers both a daytime and an evening Alpha program.
 - Fr. Thomas Walsh ends his pastorate at St. Mary's, effective January 26. Fr. Tom is transferred to St. Christine's Parish in Marshfield, MA.
 - The CYO and Youth Service Corps combine efforts to serve the young people of the parish by promoting activities of service, faith, and community.
 - Fr. David P. Callahan becomes St. Mary's twelfth pastor, effective June 1.
 - Pope John Paul II is called home to God on April 2, 2005.
 - On April 19, Joseph Cardinal Ratzinger is elected to the office of Universal Shepherd and takes the name of Pope Benedict XVI.
 - Fr. David Goodrow ends his assignment at St. Mary's Parish in May. Fr. David is transferred to St. Patrick's Parish in Stoneham, MA.
 - Fr. David Marcham begins his assignment at St. Mary's.
 - In November, Eucharistic Adoration changes from Monday evenings and Fridays to Thursdays, from 9:30 a.m. until 7:30 p.m.
 - The Christmas Eve Mass schedule is 4:00 p.m. (upstairs and downstairs), 4:00 p.m. (Children's Pageant at Horace Mann Auditorium), 6:00 p.m. (upstairs and downstairs), 7:00 p.m. (downstairs). The Christmas Day Mass schedule is 9:00 a.m. (upstairs and downstairs) and 10:30 a.m. (upstairs and downstairs).

- The Pastoral Staff consists of Fr. David P. Callahan (pastor), Fr. Ted Kofitse, Fr. David S. Marcham, Fr. Francis W. Beksha (in residence), Deacon Richard P. Delio, and Nan Rafter (Pastoral Associate/Parish Nurse).
- 2006
- The 40 and Over Catholic Singles Group is formed.
 - In May, Parish Pastoral Council elections are held.
 - *The Milford Daily News* sponsors the 1st Annual St. Rocco Chocolate Chip Cookie Contest.
 - On September 11, a Holy Hour is held in remembrance of the 5th anniversary of September 11, 2001.
 - St. Mary's Prayer and Play Group for families of children with health difficulties and/or special needs holds its first meeting in October.
 - The first Grand Annual Collection is held.
 - During Advent, children in the 3rd grade Religious Ed. classes take up a collection to help a parish in New Orleans rebuild from Hurricane Katrina.
 - The church bell tower is repaired.
 - Fr. Frank Beksha ends his years of ministry at St. Mary's. Fr. Frank retires on December 31, 2006.
 - 752 members of the community receive Christmas presents through the Caring Tree.
- 2007
- On February 6, St. Mary's Parish celebrates 130 years of faith, hope, love, and service, and begins a year-long endeavor entitled "130 Random Acts of Kindness."
 - Fr. David Marcham ends his assignment at St. Mary's.
 - St. Mary's embarks on the formulation of a comprehensive parish plan, concentrating on four major areas: spiritual needs, facilities/buildings, education, and finances.
 - The Parish Center Planning Committee is formed.
 - The Family Mass celebration is enhanced with a children's bulletin, a host family, and the Children's Lectionary.
 - St. Mary's is part of a collaborative (formerly called cluster) consisting of parishes in Medway, Bellingham, and Franklin.
 - A parish mission is held in May.
 - St. Mary's Catholic Women's Club celebrates its 85th anniversary.
 - St. Mary's bulletin expands to 8 pages.
 - Phase II of the Church Restoration Project begins. The front stairs, the front elevation of the church, and the right elevation of the church will be addressed.
 - In April, St. Mary's Parish is honored by *USA WEEKEND* and the National Make A Difference Day Committee.
 - Parish Pastoral Council elections take place in June.
 - Fr. Robert Blaney begins his service at St. Mary's in June.
 - In August, the Town of Franklin is chosen by *Family Circle* magazine as one of the 10 Best Towns for Families in the country.
 - Volunteers are sought to help put together a "Youth Ministry Program."

- The Pastoral Staff consists of Fr. David P. Callahan, Fr. Ted Kofitse, Fr. Robert J. Blaney, Deacon Richard P. Delio, and Pastoral Associate/Parish Nurse, Health & Homebound Ministry Coordinator Nan Rafter. The Religious Education staff consists of Isabel Coyne, Karen Ackles, Sheila Hooper, and Liz Bertoni. The Director of Music Ministries is Drina Menard. The Rectory Office Staff consists of Paula Coughlin, Claire Perry, Louise Vozzella, and Paulette Thomas.
- 2008
- The new Youth Ministry Team coordinates a monthly Youth Mass, especially for 6th-12th graders, on Sunday evenings at 5:30. The first Mass is Sunday, January 6, with over 500 youth in attendance.
 - A parish mission is held in February.
 - Approximately 3,000 children attend Religious Education classes.
 - Cardinal Seán O'Malley visits St. Mary's on Palm Sunday.
 - In April, a St. Mary's Players Reunion is held for all those involved in past musical productions at St. Mary's.
 - A parish survey is conducted during the month of May.
 - The annual Memorial Day Mass is held at St. Mary's Cemetery.
 - The weekend Masses are celebrated on Saturday at 4:00 p.m. and 7:00 p.m., and Sunday at 7:30, 9:00 (upstairs and downstairs – except for the summer months), 10:30, and noon.
 - A special collection is taken to purchase a new sound system for the upper church, improve the downstairs sound system, and repair and paint troubled areas in the upper church.
 - The 30th annual Feast of St. Rocco is held in August.
 - St. Mary's Youth Ministry Web Site is launched in September.
 - The grounds in the front of the church receive some fresh landscaping.
 - *ARISE Together in Christ*, a three-year parish-centered process of spiritual renewal and evangelization, begins in fall 2008.
 - St. Mary's volunteer appreciation nights are held in October.
 - The first meeting of the Web Site Committee takes place in November.
 - St. Mary's new Web site goes live in December.
 - Masses are celebrated on Christmas Eve at 4:00 p.m. (upstairs and downstairs), 4:00 p.m. (Christmas Pageant Mass at Horace Mann School), 6:00 p.m. upstairs (and downstairs if needed) and 7:30 p.m. Midnight Mass is celebrated. Christmas Day Masses are at 9:00 and 10:30 a.m.
- 2009
- Deacon Dick Delio presents a talk on Haiti where he has been visiting since 1996, ministering to the people.
 - A new Hospitality Committee is formed.
 - Fr. Robert J. Blaney ends his assignment at Saint Mary's Parish in February. Fr. Bob is transferred to Saint Theresa of Avila Parish in West Roxbury.
 - Our Lady of Lourdes Healing Novena begins in February.
 - Parishioners attend the Boston Catholic Men's and Women's Conferences in April.
 - Fr. David P. Callahan ends his pastorate at Saint Mary's, effective May 12. Fr. Dave is transferred to Saint Mary's Parish in Quincy, MA.

- The daily Mass schedule for Lent is 7:00 a.m., 9:00 a.m., and 5:15 p.m.
 - Fr. Thomas P. Kelly of the Emergency Response Team serves Saint Mary's on an interim basis.
 - Fr. Ted Kofitse ends his assignment at Saint Mary's Parish in May. Fr. Ted is appointed Parochial Vicar at Saint Mary of the Sacred Heart Parish in Hanover, MA, effective June 2.
 - Fr. Brian F. Manning becomes St. Mary's thirteenth pastor, effective May 12.
 - Fr. Frank Campo, newly ordained, begins his assignment at Saint Mary's on June 2.
 - A new format for the bulletin appears in June.
 - His Holiness Pope Benedict XVI declares a **YEAR FOR PRIESTS** from June 19, 2009 to June 19, 2010.
 - The Rock Youth Ministry conducts a survey of all parishioners in July.
 - The 31st Annual Feast of Saint Rocco takes place in August.
 - New cloth panels enhance the sanctuary.
 - In September, the new Mass schedule is Saturday at 4:00 p.m., Sunday at 7:30 a.m., 9:00 a.m. (with a special Children's Liturgy of the Word in the lower church), 10:30 a.m., 12:00 noon, and a new 5:00 p.m. Mass (September through May) with contemporary music and a focus on youth, but every age is welcome to attend.
 - The Rock Youth Ministry presents faith building, service, and social opportunities for middle and high school students on a regular basis, beginning in September.
 - Eucharistic Adoration moves to Fridays, beginning in September. Benediction begins at 4:45 p.m.
 - *ARISE Together in Christ* resumes in September.
 - Parishioners may sign up for a "Choose Life" MA license plate.
 - Almost 2800 youth participate in the Religious Education program. Almost 150 catechists assist in the teaching.
 - Deacon Richard P. Delio ends his assignment at Saint Mary's in October.
 - At Christmastime, the Caring Tree touches the hearts of almost 800 individuals.
 - The Pastoral Staff consists of Fr. Brian F. Manning, Fr. Frank Campo, and Pastoral Associate/Parish Nurse, Health & Homebound Ministry Coordinator Nan Rafter.
