- _____ 1. Left her life of privilege and founded a religious order, the Sisters of the Blessed Sacrament. Established schools for Native Indian-American and African-American children. Established nearly 60 schools and missions in the U.S.
- _____ 2. Returned to Ireland as a missionary. Used a three-leaf clover to explain the Holy Trinity. "Christ in the heart of every person who thinks of me, Christ in the eye that sees me, Christ in the ear that hears me." Influential teacher.
- _____ 3. Great devotion to Divine Mercy. Canonized St. Faustina. Designated the second Sunday of Easter to be Divine Mercy Sunday. Was canonized in April 2014 on Divine Mercy Sunday.
- _____ 4. Apostle and Secretary of God's mercy. Kept a diary at the direction of her confessors and the Lord. Stood out because of her sensitivity to the poor. Received visions of Divine Mercy. Received a message of mercy from the Lord. Bore a hidden stigmata.
- _____ 5. Spent 16 hours a day hearing confessions-the Sacrament of Mercy. Patron saint of parish priests.
- _____ 6. Often depicted on a mountaintop. Pope John Paul II called him "a man of the Beatitudes." Was extraordinary in his ordinariness. Gave freely to the poor and sick. His body will be brought to Krakow for World Youth Day in 2016.
- _____ 7. Protector and guardian of the Virgin Mother of God. Scriptures have no record of words spoken by him. All four Gospels make reference to him. Is considered the model of pious behavior, who receives grace at the moment of death. Is often mentioned as being silent. The silence speaks volumes. He was a man of action. Patron saint of a happy death.
- _____ 8. Excelled at instructing the ignorant (those uninformed about Jesus Christ). Is symbolized by a lion.
- _____ 9. When this saint was 13 years old in 1858, the Beautiful Lady appeared to her 18 times. The Blessed Mother asked this saint to build a grotto at Lourdes.
- _____ 10. One of the seven women, along with the Blessed Virgin Mary, who is commemorated by name in the Canon of the Mass. Trusted in God's mercy.

- _____ 11. Converted to Catholicism. First American-born citizen to be canonized. Founded the first religious community of women in America. Co-founder of the first free Catholic school system in America. Formed NY City's first charity.
- _____ 12. Name comes from Old English word for "prayer."
- _____ 13. Visited the sick, the elderly, and the poor. Patron saint of charitable societies.
- _____ 14. One of the American Church's most prolific writers. Had a TV program: *Life Is Worth Living*.
- _____ 15. Published and sold the paper, *The Catholic Worker*, in Greenwich Village. Peace activist. Canonical inquiry into her life has begun.
- _____ 16. Offered his service to the care of the lepers on the island of Molokai, Hawaii. Built schools, churches, hospitals, and coffins. Contracted leprosy in 1885. St. Marianne Cope joined him in Hawaii.
- _____ 17. Received the Nobel Peace Prize in 1979. Will be canonized by Pope Francis during this Year of Mercy on September 4. Worked on the streets of Calcutta bringing mercy to those most in need.
- _____ 18. Established an orphanage and children's hospital for the poor children. Worked in Peru. Was called "Martin of Charity."
- _____ 19. In the poor, the suffering, and the sick, he saw the image of Christ. Heard confessions from dawn to dusk. His mortal remains were brought to the Vatican on Ash Wednesday of this year to remind pilgrims of the importance of confession—the Sacrament of Mercy. Bore the stigmata. Heard John Paul II's confession. Died in 1968.
- _____ 20. Known as "The Little Flower." Pope Pius X called her "the greatest saint of modern times." Autobiography: *Story of a Soul*. Doctor of the Universal Church. Prayed fervently for the success of the missions. Will shower a rain of roses upon the world.
- _____ 21. Born in Italy. Founded an order, 70 orphanages, schools, and hospitals scattered over eight countries. Organized catechism and education classes for Italian immigrants.
- _____ 22. "Lily of the Mohawks." Uncle was the chief of the Mohawk village. A convert at the age of 19. Lived a life of extreme prayer and penance.
- _____ 23. Missionary to the lepers of Molokai, Hawaii. Brought education and happiness to the leper colony, even providing bright scarves and pretty dresses for the women. Worked with St. Damien.
- _____ 24. Spent a year in a prison camp during World War I. For 40 years, spent 12 hours a day hearing confessions. His mortal remains were brought to the Vatican on Ash Wednesday of this year to remind pilgrims of the importance of confession—the Sacrament of Mercy. Suffered lifelong physical ailments. Died in 1942.
- _____ 25. Known for founding the great mission of San Juan Capistrano in California. Canonized by Pope Francis on his trip to America last year.
- _____ 26. Educated children and cared for the poor, sick, and dying. Lead a small group of missionary sisters to Indiana. Lived as a model of belief in God's mercy. Opened schools in Illinois and Indiana. Left a "legacy of love, mercy, and justice that continues today."
- _____ 27. At age 9, witnessed several apparitions at Fatima. Suffered courageously.
- _____ 28. Welcomed neglected children, teaching them right from wrong.
- _____ 29. Bore the stigmata. Canticle of the Sun. Tamed "Brother Wolf."
- _____ 30. Served in the military. Carried out the Christian duties of the Corporal and Spiritual Works of Mercy. Called "The Good Pope." Convened the Second Vatican Council. Upon his death, a newspaper drawing had the simple caption, "A Death in the Family."
