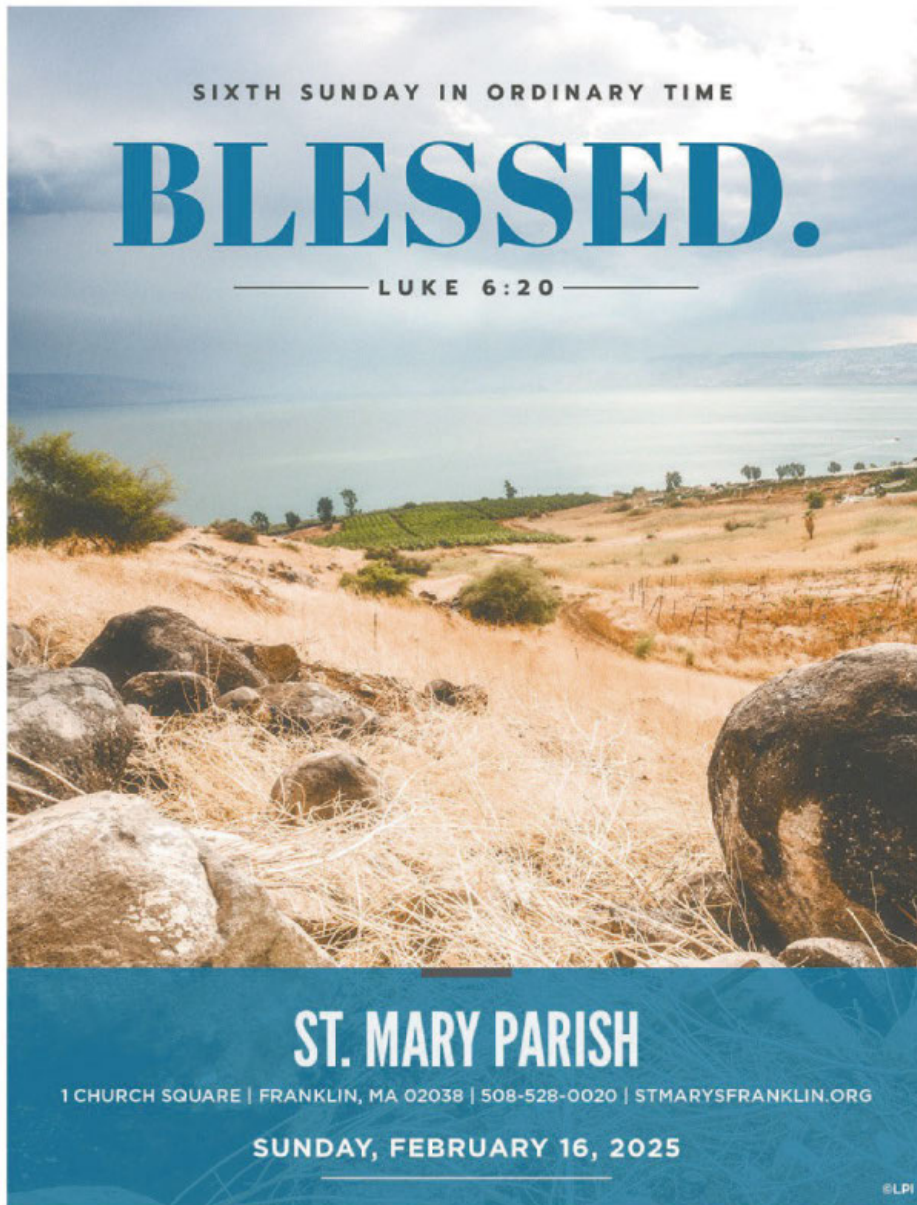

**Mardi Gras**

**Question:** Carnivale and Mardi Gras celebrations are linked to Ash Wednesday, Lent, fast and abstinence. Can you tell us more about the connections between these events?

**Answer:** Ash Wednesday is the beginning of the forty days known as Lent. Every year, Christians highlight this penitential season as a time of self-examination, reformation of one's life, and continued development of a deeper spiritual life. The recommended practices of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving become the focus of Lenten activity and ritual. Each of these spiritual practices is aimed at personal discipline as well as continued concern for the other, especially the poor or alienated.

Forty days is a symbolic biblical period of time, during which personal transformation occurs and out of which people surface as more spiritual, ready to carry out God's mission. Relying on God's providence and care, no matter how difficult life becomes, is crucial to Lenten spirituality. Fasting was initially stricter, permitting only one simple meal a day without meat, fish, or other delicacies. Such things were not even allowed in the house.

In order to prepare for this in an age of no refrigeration, people gathered to consume whatever was not allowed during Lent. This led to parties or celebrations originally referred to as Carnivale, literally meaning "goodbye to meat," or Mardi Gras, literally meaning "Fat Tuesday." The eating and celebrating ended on the Tuesday just before Ash Wednesday. Today we focus more on moderation in all things, as well as a strong concern the poor. ## A History of the Jubilee

This week, we will present the history of the Jubilee Year. As noted in the bulletin on February 2, the Jubilee was mentioned in the book of Leviticus. In Isaiah 61:1-2, the prophet Isaiah tells us that the anointed one will fulfill some of the Jubilee's demands, (proclaim liberty to the captives, release the prisoners, etc.). In Luke 4:21, we hear Jesus, at the beginning of his public ministry, apply this passage from Isaiah to himself.

The first Christian Jubilee was held in 1300, called by Pope Boniface VIII. In the mid-1400s, Paul II decreed that Jubilees should be celebrated every 25 years. These are what are called Ordinary Jubilee Years. Jubilees can be called by the reigning Pope at other times as well; these are called Extraordinary Jubilees, the most recent of which was called by Pope Francis in 2015.

## Pilgrimages

According to the Catechism, "Pilgrimages evoke our earthly journey toward heaven and are traditionally very special occasions for renewal in prayer. For pilgrims seeking living water, shrines are special places for living the forms of Christian prayer "in Church." (CCC 2691)

The Jubilee calls us to set out on a personal journey of conversion, to reconcile with God, and pilgrimages are a beautiful tool in the Church to facilitate just that. When we travel, we not only change location, but we ourselves change. Pilgrimages have pastoral value and offer opportunities for conversion and spiritual growth. The Book of Blessings offers blessings for pilgrims on their departure and their return to remind them of the purpose of pilgrimages, the Christian model they are to be while on it, and a reminder to live out the conversion they experienced. Please see Chapter 8 (595-616) for these particular blessings.

Pilgrimages for the Jubilee are being offered within the Archdiocese of Boston, and there are also opportunities to make a pilgrimage to Rome. May we truly be pilgrims of hope!

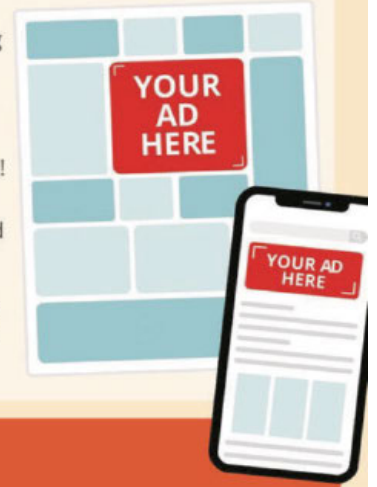
