
Grand Annual Collection

This month we will look at the Catholic Social Teaching theme of **Option for the Poor and** Vulnerable. The US Bishops write on their website (https://bit.ly/USCCBCSTresource) that "a basic moral test is how our most vulnerable members are faring...our tradition instructs us to put the needs of the poor and vulnerable first." Several biblical passages and Church documents, such as VULNERABLE the Catechism of the Catholic Church remind us of the moral imperative to assist our brothers and sisters in need. Our actions in light of this great responsibility do not have to place us in an "us vs.

them" situation. In their 1986 pastoral letter, Economic Justice for All, The US Bishops say that "the "option for the poor," therefore, is not an adversarial slogan that pits one group or class against another. Rather it states that the deprivation and powerlessness of the poor wounds the whole community"

So, let's do our part in meeting the moral challenge in front of us to heal some of the wounds of our society. Involvement with the parish St. Vincent de Paul Society and Pastoral Visitors program as well as with various community boards, councils and organizations are ways to help provide for others.
